Standard PPE on uniform code should be gathered for the address of safety and agency compliance. Also the dinner at what point do we look at this and start providing meals that are more suited to the clientell (firefighters and parramedics) loose the a la carte.</p>																																
<p>Personal agendas should not be forced on teams in the de-brief after a sceanrio. These should be submitted formally to ARRO prior to the event. Commends made in our de-brief did not reflect our performance (controlled scenario). Supporting a door with your hand is not a safe practice. The technical judge in the immediate pit suggested we should do this. Teams are to be less Hollywood and more like it is on the road as stated by ARRO and certain judges. This I think cannot be achieved. If it is to be achieved then the stop watch and judges will have to be removed from the competition e.g. hazarrds that are not present are not reported back to the incident commander on the road. Only hazards that are present are reported.</p>
