



DUTY STATEMENT – PRESIDENT

Position: President

The President of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation is charged with overall responsibility for the operation and management of organisation including its Challenges, Committees, Members, Assessors and external relations.

The President, who chairs the Executive Committee Meetings, Annual General Meeting and Extra-Ordinary meetings, is also responsible for providing leadership in advancing the organisation's rescue policies to meet national and international needs.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. Lead the development of a long-term strategic plan that guides the development of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation.
2. Oversee the preparation of the annual operational plan and budget as well as creating the infrastructure and processes necessary for effective and efficient implementation of these plans to achieve the strategic goals and objectives.
3. Initiative and cultivate partnerships and other relationships with the private and public sectors and other groups, eliciting support for the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation and its contribution to road rescue and knowledge building.
4. Represent the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation's interests at state, national and international levels in professional and other associations that influence policies in technology and road rescue education.
5. Establish and maintain a mutually enriching and rewarding relationship with the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation members, immediate community and stakeholders.
6. Pursue strategies to secure the financial stability of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation and ensure the development of, and adherence to, policies and guidelines that foster financial prudence and propriety in managing the affairs of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation.
7. Provide leadership in fundraising, exploring new funding models, using multiple sources to establish and maintain a consistent flow of funds for the long-term sustainability of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation's programs.
8. As Chairman of the Executive Committee, provide leadership in the review/design of programs of high quality that facilitate integration with evolving societal needs and enhance the reputation of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation as an institution of high standards.
9. Provide appropriate infrastructure that engenders a productive research environment and cultivates a culture of quality teaching and learning.
10. Initiate, develop and support strategic collaborative and cooperative ventures with industry and other appropriate partners including local and international organizations to enhance the teaching/learning and research capabilities of the Australasian Road Rescue Organisation.



11. Maintain a close working relationship with and provide strategic overview of the activities of the Executive Officer.
12. Explore sponsorship (cash and in-kind) opportunities that will promote and sustain ARRO's financial position and the delivery of the ARC.
13. Promote ARRO to key stakeholder groups such as AFAC, WRO, ACRS, etc.

- The position is filled at the Annual General Meeting and held for 2 years.
